

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the RCR (Realtime Certified Reporter) credential?

The RCR is a NYSCRA certification validating expertise in stenographic realtime competency.

Why become realtime certified with NYSCRA?

- Decrease editing time to maximize earning potential
- Hold an elite credential with ability to update your resume/email signature
- Receive realtime recognition from the New York State and United States court systems

How do I register for the RCR?

Submit payment through <u>nyscra.org/testing</u> to receive an online calendar link to schedule your preferred date and time. Initial signups require completing registration requirements.

How does the fee structure work?

- First-time testers pay \$150 as members and \$250 as nonmembers.
- Retesting is \$95 for members and \$195 for nonmembers.

What are the test specifications of the RCR?

- Two (five-minute) exams are administered at 200 WPM preceded by a two-minute warm-up.
- Tests are Q&A two-voice testimony.

Are there prerequisites or policies?

- A declaration of employment or certificate of graduation proof may be required.
- NYSCRA credentials are valid with memberships in good standing. No CEUs are required.
- Nonmembers attaining a passing grade must become members to receive the RCR credential.

What is my responsibility as a test-taker?

Test-takers should become familiar with the testing protocol described in the *RCR Online Guide* provided after registration. Knowledge of Zoom and screen-sharing is required.

What is the cancellation policy?

- Reschedule at discounted fee 10 days prior to Test Day.
- No refunds are honored. Credit may be applied for emergencies with proof provided.

What are the translation file requirements?

The specifications for setting up your test file and creating a job dictionary are included in the *RCR Online Guide* provided after registration.

What if I took the NYRCR at a lower speed and now want to take the RCR credential at the current speed?

All NYRCR credentialed members can retake the RCR exams at the retest discounted rates. Contact <u>testing@nyscranow.org</u> for your retest link.

What benchmarks should a prospective test-taker achieve to feel ready to test?

The ability to write Q&A dictation at 200 WPM with clean translation that includes punctuation.
